



Job Title: Volunteer Engagement Intern

Employment Type: Unpaid (Volunteer)

Responsibilities:

The following functions describe the essential functions of this role. Other additional related duties may be assigned from time to time.

1. Organize summer volunteer appreciation event.
2. Assist with soliciting lunches for on-site volunteers.
3. Assist with various administrative tasks, including, but not limited to, data entry, sending donor mailings, and creating spreadsheets.
4. Create volunteer-focused content for social media channels.
5. Create volunteer orientation video.
6. Assist with creating quarterly newsletter and capital campaign updates.
7. Recruit new volunteers to the ReStore and build site.
8. Solicit lunches for build volunteers.
9. Assist with checking in volunteers at build site.
10. Create volunteer experience survey.
11. Other duties as assigned.

- Ability to think creatively and problem solve effectively.
- Determination and willingness to develop new skills.
